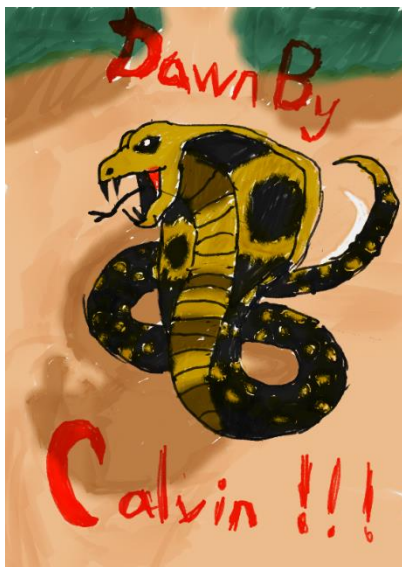
Pentecost Picnic
